




Spotlight on Learning

YR

In Maths, the children in Hedgehogs and Squirrels have been finding and representing the numbers 6,7 and 8.

In Literacy, they have been using non-fiction texts to find out about space. The children also had a go at making their own non-fiction book about space.



In Year 1 this week the children have made their puppets! They had to sew around the edges using a needle and thread, and then decorate them using felt, feathers, wool and googly eyes! They had a great time! In Geography we have looked at how penguins can survive in the Antarctic, and have learnt the story map for our focus story in English 'Lost and Found'. In our Maths lessons we have been putting numbers to 20 on a number line and knowing one more and one less than a number to 20.







Y2

This week, Foxes and Owls have been exploring different habitats in Science. They went outside to identify different plants and animals and then discussed where they were found. This week in PSHE each group was given the name of an animal. The children's task was to work in groups and use their persuasive skills to convince other groups that their animal was the best in the world. They had to work together and listen to each other's points of view

In English, they have been working on writing a description of a setting. They used their senses to help build ideas.

In RE the children have been discussing how Muslims live their life. They looked at the five pillars of Islam and discussed how and why they are important to Muslims.
