Spotlight on Learning

YR

In Maths, the children have been learning “more”, “fewer” and “the same” to compare numbers. The children are learning their first sounds in Phonics. In RE they have been learning about how different religions welcome new born babies and the ceremonies that are held to welcome the child.

Y1
