


Spotlight on Learning

In Literacy the children have been learning about winter. They thought carefully about the clothes they should wear in the winter and the reasons why. They also had a look at some animals that you will find in cold places.

In Maths the children have been learning about the different combinations to make the numbers 6.7 and 8.










This week the children have completed our Big Writes based on *Lost and Found* by Oliver Jeffers and they have all made a fantastic effort to show us their best writing!
