
# **Spotlight on Learning**

YR

In Literacy, the children have been looking at modern toys and toys from the past. They have been examining the similarities and differences between old and new toys.



The children have also been writing lists of toys they would like for Christmas.



In Maths the children have learning to subitise amounts to 5. The children know the meaning of subitise "you look at an amount and say it without counting".

# Y1

Year 1 have been learning about the properties of 2D shapes and how to make repeating patterns correctly. In PHSE they have been learning how to respond to bullying and how to be confident and assertive.

# Y2

In PSHE the Y2 children made worry dolls following a lesson reading *Silly Billy* by Anthony Browne about a boy who worries about 'silly' things. He finds sharing his worries with his worry doll helps him to sleep.



In History, the children chose who they thought was to blame for the Gunpowder Plot and had to explain

why. In Maths they have been exploring 3D shapes and learning about their properties using the vocabulary 'faces, edges, vertices and curved surface'.

In English, the children have written their own versions of the poem *Missing: Daisy, Anyone seen my Dragon?* by James Carter.
