All Stars Assembly

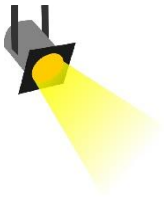

Spotlight on Learning

Year R

This week in Squirrels, we have been reading the story of The Town Mouse and The Country Mouse. We have been talking about the features of a town and the features of the countryside and comparing how they are different. The children have made little mice from salt dough and tried to build a town from cardboard boxes.

In Maths we have been learning about special pairs of numbers that add together to make 10. For example, $5+5$, $6+4$, $7+3$. This understanding is really important for future Maths learning! We call these number bonds to 10.

Year 1

This week in Year 1 we received a message in a bottle! It was from the friendly pirates who wanted to play hide and seek. We have read the pirates are coming story. We were surprised by the end of the story!

In Maths we have started to look at numbers up to 50. We are learning to count in tens and are working really hard to remember which number comes after 29, 39 and 49!

We have been learning about monarchs. We know what a monarch is and what qualities is needed to be a good monarch.

We enjoyed making our own crowns and writing our own rules if we were a monarch.

Year 2

In English, we have been learning the TRUE story of the three little pigs which is from the wolf's point of view, and he is trying to prove his innocence. We have written sentences about the wolf and answered questions about the story.

In maths we have been understanding odd and even numbers and beginning work on multiplication and division.

In RE, we have been learning about the Easter story and what it means to Christians. We have done freeze frames and acted out parts of the story.

In science, we have been learning about animals and their offspring, considering whether babies look like their adults and sorting them into animal groups.

In history, we have begun learning about King Richard III and writing facts about him.
