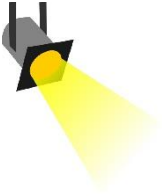

Spotlight on Learning

Year R

In Squirrels this week we have been learning the story of The Little Red Hen. We have made our own story map and learnt actions to go with it. We have made our own hens made from felt and stuffing. These were tricky but we persevered and they look really good!

In Maths we have been thinking about part whole models and how we can show the whole number and its parts.

Year 1

This week in Year 1 we have started to change 'The Pirates are coming' to make our own story! We have been practising telling each other the original story using our story maps. All of the adults are really impressed with how well we have learnt the story.

In Maths we have continued to learn about numbers to 50. We can confidently say how many 'tens' and 'ones' there are in numbers to 50. We have been counting in 10s and estimating where numbers go on a number line.

We have been learning about what life was like at the time of Queen Elizabeth and Queen Victoria. We looked at the difference in modes of transport and what towns and cities looked like and what people wore then. We compared this to what we previously learnt about what life was like for our grandparents in October.

Year 2

This week in Year 2, we have been learning the 5 and ten times table and their corresponding division facts. We can count in 5s and 10s, look for patterns and calculate how many groups of 5 and 10 make a number.

In English, we have summarised the True Story of the Three Little Pigs and then we will be planning our own stories next week involving a character from a traditional tale who is wrongly accused.

In History, we have been learning about the battle of Bosworth, when it took place and why. We learnt that despite having more men, King Richard III was ultimately defeated and de-throned by Henry Tudor, ending the war of the Roses. The children ordered the events leading up to and surrounding the battle. **A reminder that we are still collecting contributions for this on Parent Pay.**

We have started some World Book day activities through Scholastic, who have offered book reads and draw alongs for the children. We read 'Goldilocks' by Ella McLeod who offers an alternative version of the traditional story from Goldilocks point of view. We also were shown how to draw a bear by the illustrator Rochelle Falconer.
