Spotlight on Learning

Year R

In Literacy we have been thinking about the celebration of Easter. The children have learnt about some Easter traditions and know that the Easter story is a special story for Christians.

In Maths we have been making and continuing patterns. We have been making patterns from actions, cubes and sounds.

Year 1

In Literacy we have been writing our non-chronological reports on Pirates. We have learnt a lot of Pirate facts, please ask us to share what we know about Pirates!

In Maths have been exploring volume and capacity. We know that capacity means the maximum amount something can hold whereas volume means what is actually in there now.

We have been looking at a texture in our art lesson. We used a range of materials to create texture in our artwork. We used our knowledge on lighter and darker to create different shades of blue for our seascape paintings.

Year 2

This week we have written a recount of our brilliant trip to Bosworth Battlefield. We put things in to chronological order and wrote about what we did, learnt and saw.

In Maths, we have been completing our work on length and measurement by comparing lengths, and ordering lengths. Understanding that m and cm are very different!

In History, we have looked at sources of information about King Richard III, what has been said about him in history and how he has been portrayed to decide why people thought he was a good king or a bad king.

In RE we been thinking about forgiveness and why it's important to forgive and how forgiveness makes us and others feel. We thought about why Christians value forgiveness so much making links to the Easter story.
