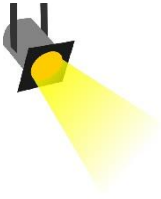

## Spotlight on Learning

### Year R

This week in Squirrels we have been learning the story of What the Ladybird Heard. We have made our own story maps and written a plan to catch the robbers! In Maths we have been learning how to share fairly, making sure we are really careful to be accurate. We have all painted ladybirds using watercolours and we have been recalling what it is like on a farm.

### Year 1

In English we have begun the preparation for our big writes. The children have innovated animals and fruit in our story. They have also enjoyed learning about some of the fruits and animals found in the southern parts of Asia.

In maths, we have been comparing numbers up to 100. We have been using 'greater than, less than and equal to'.

In preparation for our trip to the Great Central Railway, the children have learnt about Thomas Cook. On the 5th July 1841, Thomas arranged for 500 people to go on a trip from Leicester to Loughborough. Before he organised a train ride from Leicester to Liverpool. He then took 150,000 people to London.

### Year 2

In English, we planted sunflower seeds then planned and wrote instructions using time adverbials, imperative verbs, and adverbs to make our instructions clear and precise.

In History we have learnt about the changes that Rosa Parks set in motion following her actions in 1955. We learnt how things were for people of colour and how things changed for the better.
